Human, Negative Gravel / Dry Terrain



- Result of human presence, of previous garden work.
- Partially weighs down and blocks natural life processes.
- Exposes cracked mud in dry weather conditions.
- Evidence of weeds and grass emerging, struggling.

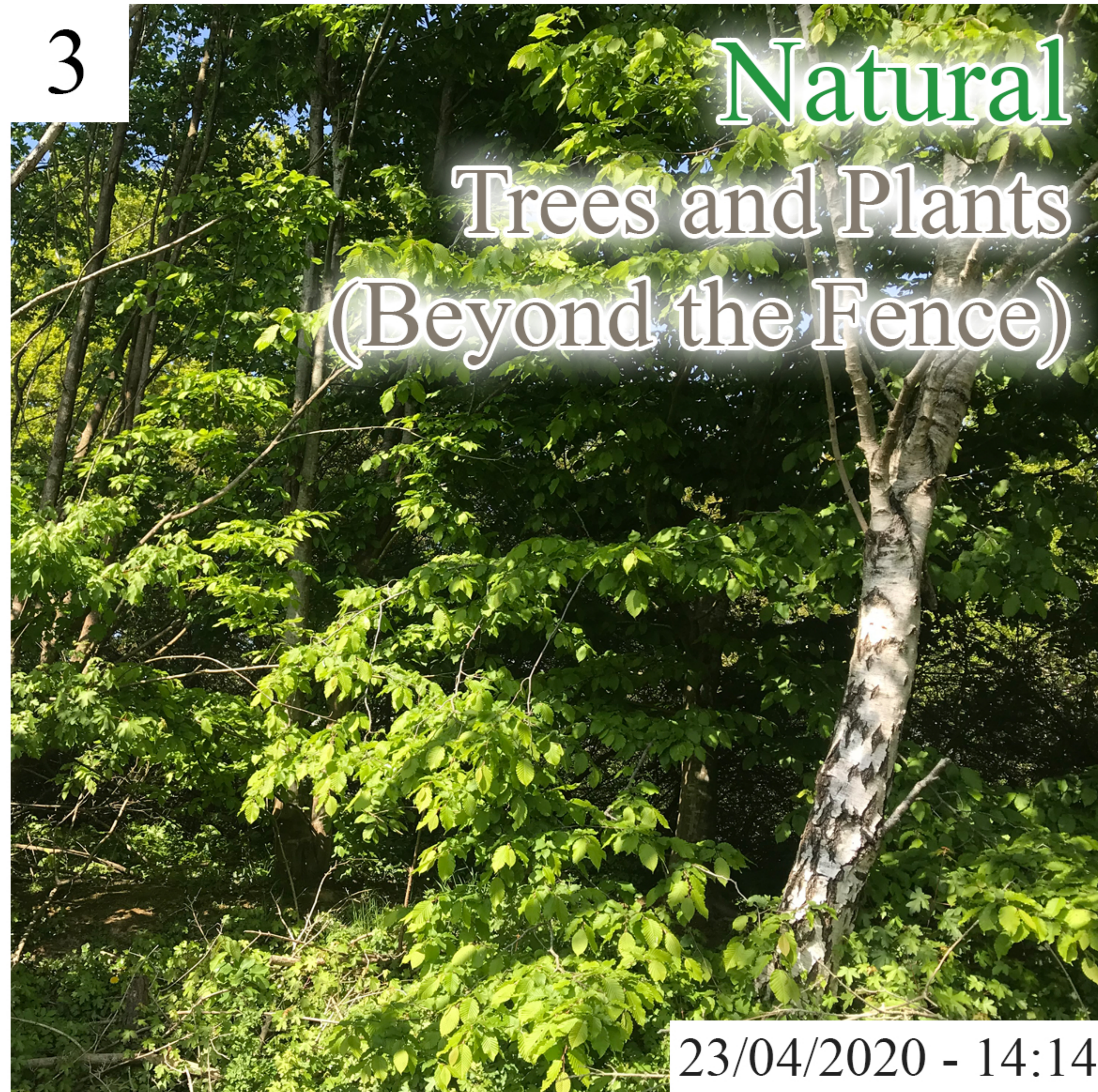

Human, Positive Apple Tree



- Result of human design as it was planted in a garden.
- Contributes to local nature for a positive impact.
- Benefits from human care.
- Not ideal conditions; the fully grown tree is struggling to support itself.

- Long-standing trees, native to the local area.
- Contribute to local nature, likely home to wildlife, and environmentally positive as trees, against climate change.
- Growth is restrained by close human development.

- Result of human presence, having been planted.
- Flowers contribute some pollen for local wildlife.
- Struggle to grow over the fence despite human efforts to support them and sustain them by watering.

Human, Neutral Concrete Bird Bath



- A manufactured object placed in the area by people.
- Takes up some natural space, potentially crushes anything growing beneath it.
- May serve as a beneficial source of water for local wildlife, as intended.

Natural-Human, Positive/Neutral Patch of Grass



- Potentially natural, though grows stimulated by human products, to their preference.
- Not visibly harmful to life in the ground.
- Unnatural human efforts are against natural spread of weeds and limit grass length.

Metal/Plastic
Rotary Washing Line



- A manufactured object in the garden before the fence.
- Takes up some natural space in the air and cuts into the ground.
- Entirely for human use of the space, not in any way environmentally beneficial.

- Not a part of human design in the place; occur of natural spreading processes.
- A minor contribution to the local environment.
- Unnatural human efforts are against natural spread of these plants.

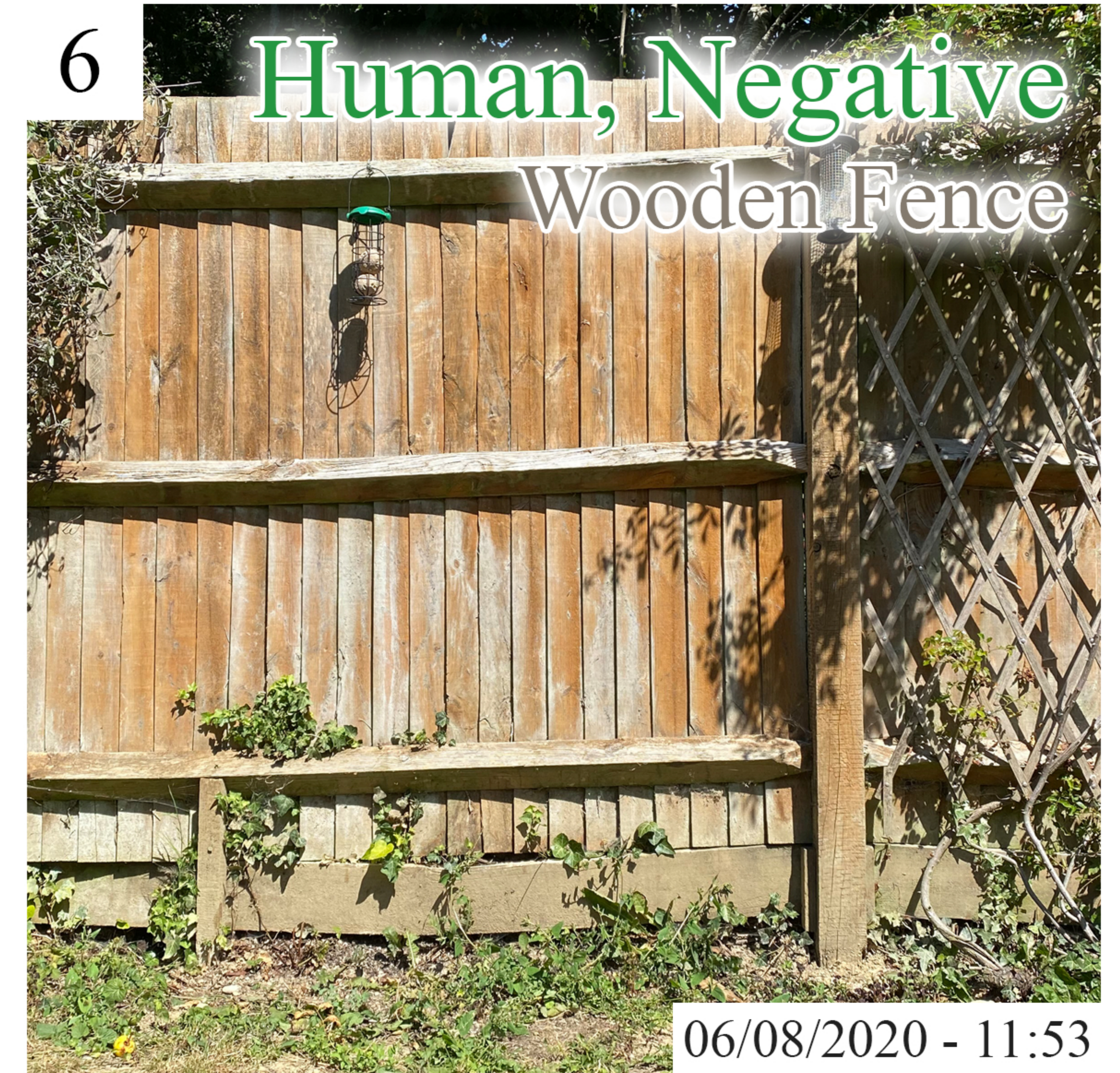
Human, Neutral Metal Bird Feeder



- A manufactured object hanging on the fence.
- Intended for and sometimes used by local wildlife as an appropriate food source
- Alters the local food web, debatably a problem. Its sharp metal may harm wildlife.

Human, Negative Wooden Fence



- A human construct for the needs of people.
- May disrupt and limit movement of local wildlife as a barrier.
- A physical barrier to local flora that also casts a shadow which limits sun exposure.
